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INTRODUCTION

I am pleased to send to you the 2006 Legal Services Corporation Fact Book. This Fact Book contains selected national data on 2006 LSC program funding, legal services to clients including Private Attorney Involvement (PAI), client demographics, and program staffing. Also included is selected historical data from prior years.

The 2006 LSC Fact Book contains actual data with no extrapolations or estimates. Most of the data is derived from the Grant Activity Reports, a data collection process required of all LSC-funded programs in which data is submitted to LSC in March of each year. The remainder of the data is collected from budget and funding records of LSC-funded programs.

The 2006 LSC Fact Book concisely compiles these vital statistics on LSC-funded programs for easy use and reference. This information offers a national perspective on the resources available to and the services provided by LSC-funded programs. It is a useful reference for the LSC community and can also be used in presenting and explaining to those outside the LSC community what LSC-funded civil legal aid programs do for those low-income persons in need of civil legal assistance.

I would like to thank Mulumebet Wolde and the staff of the LSC Office of Information Management, under the direction of John Meyer, for their careful work in preparing this 2006 LSC Fact Book.

¹ There are three types of service areas: Basic Field – General, which are geographical areas that are States and other political jurisdictions or portions thereof, collectively covering all of the United States and serving all client-eligible persons therein; Basic Field – Migrant, which are entire States or political jurisdictions, but are limited to serving eligible Migrant Farmworkers therein; and Basic Field – Native American, which are descriptive and only approximately geographical and serve only Native Americans therein. Grantee programs may, and often do, serve more than one service area.

² The computation of the number of attorneys includes all Job Codes 5 to 11 (Litigation Director to Staff Attorney) and all Directors and Deputy Directors who are attorneys. It does not include the small number of attorneys serving in non-attorney positions – e.g. Management Professionals who are attorneys.





¹⁰ Counsel and Advice - A case closed as a result of the provision of advice to an eligible client in a case, e.g., the review of relevant information and the counseling of the client on action(s) to take to address a legal problem.

Brief Service - A case closed as a result of an action taken at or within a few days or weeks of intake on behalf of an eligible client, e.g., the preparing of a short letter, the making of a telephone call, or the preparation of a routine legal document such as a simple will.

Referred After Legal Assessment - A case closed in the course of providing assistance to an eligible client because the client is referred outside the program (e.g., to a social service agency or a non-LSC provider) because the client would be better served by a referral outside the program.





2006 Ethnicity of LSC Clients



- 13 Private Attorney Involvement (PAI) is an LSC program to involve private attorneys (those not working for an LSC grantee) in the delivery of legal services to low-income clients eligible for LSC-funded legal assistance. As provided in 45 C.F.R. 1614, LSC grantees are required to devote at least 12.5% of the amount of their LSC Basic Field-General funding to this method of delivery of legal services.
- 14 Pro Bono PAI programs in which attorneys are recruited and assisted to provide legal services to eligible clients without compensation.

Contract/Judicare – PAI programs in which attorneys are compensated at a reduced rate to provide legal services to eligible clients, either

- (1) Under a **contract** with the grantee program under which an attorney receives a reduced fee either for a single case or for a set number of cases.
- (2) As a member of a "**Judicare**" panel where all private attorneys who practice in the service area are invited to participate. Attorneys may elect on a case-by-case basis whether to take a client. Under some models clients may choose freely among panel attorneys while under others, panel attorneys are assigned to a client by rotation.

Other PAI – Any PAI program not falling into the pro bono or contract/Judicare category, such as co-counseling arrangements with individual attorneys or law firms.






