#### **PREFACE**

I am pleased to present the 2012 Legal Services Corporation Fact Book. This Fact Book contains selected national data on 2012 LSC program funding; legal services provided to clients by LSC grantees, including services provided through Private Attorney Involvement (PAI); client demographics; and program staffing. Selected historical data from prior years are also included.

The 2012 LSC Fact Book reflects actual data with no extrapolations or estimates. Most of the data are derived from the Grant Activity Reports that LSC-funded grantees are required to submit in February and March of each year reflecting activity in the previous calendar year. The remainder of the data is collected from budget and funding records of LSC grantees.

This year we have updated the Fact Book to make it easier for a wider audience to use and have included trend data to show changes over time. This information offers a national perspective on the resources available to and the services provided by LSC grantees. It presents a useful overview of the work of LSC grantees on behalf of lowincome persons in need of civil legal assistance.






#### **FUNDING**

LSC receives an annual appropriation from Congress to make grants to eligible non-profit organizations delivering legal aid to low-income people. LSC awards grants through a competitive process and currently funds 134 legal aid organizations that serve hundreds of thousands of low-income individuals, children, families, seniors, and veterans across America. Funds are distributed on a per-capita basis according to each service area's share of the eligible poverty population.

The federal contribution to civil legal aid does not meet all the eligible population's legal needs; rather, it provides the foundation upon which LSC's grantees can build. LSC grantees supplement federal funds with other resources, such as Interest on Lawyers' Trust Account (IOLTA) funds, state and local funding, grants from philanthropic foundations, and contributions from private donors. They also collaborate with a wide network of private practitioners, bar associations, law schools, access to justice commissions, and business and community organizations to expand legal services to indigent clients.


Change in States' and Territories' Poverty Populations: 2000 Census to American Community Survey 2011




#### Constituents Eligible for LSC-Funded Legal Aid

The number of Americans eligible for LSC-funded legal assistance, *i.e.* those living at or below 125% of the federal poverty line, continues to be near all-time high levels. In 2007, before the economic downturn, 50.8 million Americans were eligible for LSC-funded legal services. In 2012, LSC estimates, based on projections calculated using the U.S. Census Bureau's 2011 poverty data and The Brookings Institution poverty population formula, that nearly one in five—61.8 million Americans—was eligible for services, a 21% increase since 2007. In 2012, these Americans had incomes of no more than \$13,963 for an individual and \$28,813 for a family of four (at or below 125% of poverty).

The map below shows the geographic concentrations of the eligible client population—those living below 125% of the federal poverty line—in 2011. The following states have the highest concentrations of eligible client populations: Mississippi (29.1%), Louisiana (25.8%), Arkansas (25.4%), Alabama (24.9%), South Carolina (24.7%), Kentucky (24.6%), Georgia (24.5%), and West Virginia (24.2%).


#### **CLIENT SERVICES**

LSC grantees handle the basic civil legal needs of the poor, addressing matters involving safety, subsistence, and family stability. Most legal aid practices are focused on family law, including domestic violence, child support and custody, and housing matters, including evictions and foreclosures.


More than a third of all cases closed by LSC grantees are family law cases. LSC grantees help parents obtain and keep custody of their children, extended family members secure guardianship of orphaned and abused children, and victims of domestic violence get protective orders. LSC grantees also work on housing cases to help people stay in their homes, including by avoiding wrongful evictions and foreclosures, renegotiating mortgages, assisting renters whose landlords are being foreclosed upon, and resolving landlord-tenant disputes.




### **CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS**





#### PRIVATE ATTORNEY INVOLVEMENT

LSC grantees leverage federal funding and maximize the number of clients they serve by involving private attorneys in the delivery of legal services, primarily through provision of services to eligible clients on a volunteer basis. Appropriate pro bono cases are referred to local attorneys who have agreed to represent eligible clients without charge.

In addition to pro bono efforts, grantees involve private attorneys through lawyer referral services sponsored by local bar associations. Such services may refer fee-generating cases to private attorneys in exchange for a commitment to accept pro bono or reduced fee referrals. Grantees also contract with private attorneys to handle individual cases or certain categories of cases, or involve private attorneys as co-counsel in complex cases on a volunteer or contract basis.

#### **STAFFING**

As independent non-profit organizations, grantees hire their own staff; grantee staff are not employed by LSC and are not government employees.

In general, legal services attorneys are paid far less than their counterparts in the private sector and significantly less than federal or state government attorneys.

LSC-funded organizations may serve an entire state, a region within a state, or a single city or county. Many grantees maintain multiple offices, while others operate only one office. Some grantees operate part-time satellite offices and run "hotlines" that provide telephone intake, advice, and referral programs to facilitate access to their services over a large geographical area.




