the senate labor committee which had solicited our views on two pieces of legislation. The response, I think, has been distributed to the board today. I believe that the president should be authorized to send that response to the committee. I have one suggestion that Ms. Bernstein made, and since she is not here, I will make it on her behalf and with my full endorsement. At one point in the draft --

CHAIRMAN DURANT: I think that she has already discussed that with Mr. Anderson.

MR. WALLACE: Okay.

CHAIRMAN DURANT: Do we need a board motion to do this?

MR. WALLACE: The board's views were solicited by Congress. It is a policy matter and I think the board ouight -CHAIRMAN DURANT: I agree.

MR. WALLACE: Since it has been discussed with Mr. Anderson, let me discuss it for the rest of the board. At one point in the draft, as you know, we refer to efforts to require negotiation and accommodation before lawsuits and we determined under our current statute that we do not have authority to enforce that.

Ms. Bernstein has noted that the state of Maryland has

required such procedures with the use of its own money and that Congress may want to consider changing the law to permit the encouragement and, indeed, the requirement of such negotiating and accommodating procedures where federal money is involved as well. None of the letter is couched of terms of "we absolutely believe you ought to do this". Ms. Bernstein has said that that is one thing Congress ought to consider. I firmly agree with that, and I think the board ought to authorize the draft of the letter to be sent to the labor committee with that amendment.

CHAIRMAN DURANT: Is there a second?

MR. VALOIS: Second.
