Appalachian Research and Defense Fund (AppalReD)	We have already had attorneys leave the program in 2012 in part due to the fact that we are on a pay freeze again in 2012. This is the third year of pay freezes in the last 4 years. Additionally, as staff members leave, we are reticent to rehire experienced attorneys to replace them as we are unsure if we can support a more experienced attorney long term.
Legal Aid of the Bluegrass	This is the biggest budget calamity since 1996. If we have further cuts, we may need to rethink our entire delivery mechanism. Froze salaries; laid off 1 secretary. Much of the remaining non-LSC funds are from time limited grants earmarked for discrete purposes which does not give us much flexibility toward meeting our goal of providing a full range of services in priority areas.
